This guide will assist you and your parents with questions you might have now and as a resource for the future as the year progresses. On your journey, you will have the opportunity to meet daily with your grade level "Core" teachers as well as other staff from DMS through their Google Classrooms for which you will be invited to join. On your schedule you will see that all of your "Core" classes and many of your encore classes will be face to face with your teachers. Since we are in school and not in an emergency health crisis like in March, all the school rules apply starting Tuesday, September 1st. I will explain those in the next section.

What will virtual learning look like?

Starting Time: Virtual School Starts Daily at 8:38 a.m to align with teacher's 2nd hour schedules.

Ending time: That depends on you. The official school day will end at 3:25 but you and your family have the opportunity to receive assistance until early evening. Virtual Teaches have been assigned to grades 5-8. You will get to meet them later in this guide and learn all about what they can do for you.

Attendance: You will be asked to mark your attendance in every Google Classroom that you enter during the day. It will be in the <u>Classwork tab</u> and you will check yourself as "Present". If you are ill and cannot attend school, your parent/guardian will need to call school and let us know. The number is 935-3307 EXT. 3000 or 3001.

What do I need for virtual learning?

- Headphones will help
- Any materials from your teachers, like textbooks, workbooks, packets
- A place to do your school work
- A can-do attitude!
- You may need specific supplies please check the <u>list</u>.
- You likely already have many items at home.



Virtual Learning Expectations

<u>Students</u>

- Check Google Classroom daily
- Fill out attendance for each class
- Turn in work on time
- Dedicate 4-5 hours to school each day
- Ask questions when help is needed
- Inform the teacher and parent if there are technology issues
- Do your best each day!
- Only use school-appropriate technology.
 Cell phone usage during class time is not permitted.

<u>Families</u>

- Check to ensure your child is logging in and doing work.
- Make sure your child has a place where they can work.
- Have a home schedule that will work for your family.
- Communicate with the teacher if help is needed.
- Communicate technology issues.
- Be able to support your child you should expect 4-5 hours of school work per day.

Other Virtual Learning Expectations

Other expectations are just like when we're in school in person.

- Clothing expectations remain the same, including ensuring that your clothing covers your body, does not reveal underwear, and does not contain inappropriate images or words.
- If you are learning virtually from a place that requires face masks, you are expected to follow those rules and wear the appropriate face masks.
- If you need technical assistance you can ask a teacher for help or enter a <u>Tech Ticket</u>.

School counseling

Trouble with friends? Not doing so well in school? Problems that create worry? Does any of this sound like something that might be going on? If so, the counselor is available to talk with students and it's confidential. Parents/guardians may also contact the counselor to discuss issues relating to their students. Teachers often talk to the counselor when they have a concern about a student.




How do virtual students get help with school work?
